

Housing Coordinator

The Milwaukee Institute of Art and Design (MIAD) seeks a full-time Housing Coordinator, reporting to the Director of Residential Living & Student Engagement, to join our student services team with an anticipated start date in January 2023. This live-in position is responsible for supervising a multi building residence life operation, housing approximately 450 students residing in five buildings. This position leads the RA staff to ensure the buildings are safe, policies are enforced, and residents' needs are addressed.

Responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Serve as the first point of contact for resident students and in cases of emergency within MIAD Student Housing.
- 2. Maintain a positive relationship and facilitate professional communication between MIAD and General Capital-owned MIAD Housing. Responsibilities include:
 - a. Document and direct student concerns to necessary parties.
 - b. Lead weekly staff meetings.
 - c. Maintain MIAD academic year and summertime programs through established agreements and contracts.
- 3. Serve as primary support for MIAD's current 13 undergraduate RA's.
- 4. Respond to various housing and academic concerns brought up by students through problem solving, utilizing all available resources, and refer students to others as appropriate.
- 5. Support the Director of Residential Living and Student Engagement to advise and coach Student Party and other student organizations when necessary.
- 6. Serve as point of contact in the evening for residents during summer programs for approximately 3 weeks in July.
- 7. Serve on committees and attend departmental/college meetings.
- 8. Establish, coordinate, and supervise a wide array of residence hall programming including, social and developmental activities, floor meetings, and all-hall meetings as needed.
- 9. Serve as academic advisor to 10-15 first year students.
- 10. Perform other duties as assigned by the Director of Residential Living & Student Engagement and/or Dean of Students.

Required Qualifications and Experience:

- Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university is required.
- Experience Preferred in Residential Life/higher education.
- Must have the ability to live on-site to provide support to residents.
- Must maintain a valid drivers license and maintain insurability to drive.
- Ability to de-escalate complex situations.

- Demonstrated experience maintaining a high-level of integrity and discretion in handling confidential and sensitive information.
- Ability to work with diverse groups of individuals and situations with a high degree of diplomacy, discretion, and professionalism required.
- Working knowledge of MS Office applications including Word, PowerPoint, database knowledge, email software, and web tools for searches and networking.
- Effective oral and written communication skills.
- Ability to work predominantly in-person.
- Ability to work independently with the ability to appropriately escalate issues to the Director of Residential Living & Student Engagement or Dean of Students.
