

Fashion and Apparel Design Full-Time Faculty Search from the Metro-Milwaukee Area

The Milwaukee Institute of Art & Design (MIAD) seeks a qualified candidate from within the Metro-Milwaukee area to fill a full-time faculty position to teach in its Fashion and Apparel Design program. The college is looking for outstanding educators who can prepare students to be innovative, critical thinkers and practitioners of 21st century clothing design. The ideal candidate will be skilled at achieving a broad range of strong learning outcomes and have a noteworthy background in the practice of apparel design. Teaching at MIAD is learning-centered, student-focused. It requires a clear commitment to working closely with undergraduate design students in an environment that fosters inclusive spaces of belonging, equity, critical discourse, and integrated learning.

This position will begin in the Fall 2024. Teaching duties include nine (9) credit hours of studio-based courses per semester as well as academic advising, associated service to the institution and committee responsibilities. Salary and rank will be determined by the candidate's teaching and professional experience.

Required Qualifications and Experience:

- MFA in Fashion/Apparel Design preferred. MFA in Fine Art or Design acceptable
 if accompanied by appropriate professional practice.
- At least one (1) year of successful prior teaching experience in Fashion and Apparel Design is preferred.
- Industry record of innovation and success in fashion or apparel design practice
- Documented experience with course development is preferred.
- Expertise in design process skills such as research, concept development, visualization, and form.
- Expertise in the apparel industry, garment construction, flat patternmaking, draping, Adobe Creative Suite, and/or Optitex Software.
- Ability to teach, critique, and provide quality feedback at all levels of college curriculum.
- Embraces collaboration and a team approach to working/teaching.
- Commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion.

Responsibilities include, but not limited to:

- Instruct in-person unless the course is assigned by the Vice President of Academic Affairs and Registrar to be delivered virtually.
- Teach a full-time load of 18 credits annually (9-credit load in the fall semester; 9-credit load in the spring semester).
- Regularly communicate and meet with students.
- Provide consistent and timely feedback of student work.
- Maintain course learning management system and course records for attendance and work.
- File grades within set deadlines.
- Maintain consistent professional skill development to maintain parity with industry standards.
- Serve as an academic advisor and perform committee work as assigned.
- Contribute and develop curriculum as requested.
- Participate in departmental and campus-wide meetings and events, as necessary.
