The Milwaukee Institute of Art & Design (MIAD) invites applications for qualified adjunct instructors to teach a variety of courses across its curriculum. Opportunities include fine arts and design practices at all undergraduate levels of study, as well as courses in Critical Studies (Natural Sciences, Writing, Humanities and Art History).

Applicants will be reviewed based on areas of expertise and instructional interest. Qualified candidates will be contacted as college needs are identified. MIAD prioritizes faculty who lead engaging, inquiry-based classes, employ active learning strategies, and foster critical and creative learning environments.

About Teaching at MIAD

Teaching at MIAD is student-centered. It requires a solid commitment to working closely with undergraduate art and design students in our degree programs, guiding them on their journey toward a successful, life-long creative practice.

We seek applicants who have experience teaching undergraduate students and/or bring a wealth of applied professional experience. Responsibilities

- Teach undergraduate course(s) and meet regularly with students.
- Provide consistent and timely communication and feedback to students via email and/or Canvas.
- Maintain accurate attendance and grading records.
- Submit grades and required course documentation by established deadlines.
- Be available for office hours as requested by students (approximately 1-2 hours/week).
- When possible, adjunct faculty are encouraged to attend departmental and campus-wide meetings.

Required Qualifications and Experience

- Masters or Doctoral degree, or a minimum of five (5) years of applicable post-baccalaureate professional experience.

Current Areas of Interest

MIAD is currently seeking adjunct faculty with expertise in the following areas:

- First-Year Experience: 3D fabrication, diverse approaches to drawing, or 2D digital making (Adobe suite).
- Natural Sciences: Ecology, entomology, or other related fields.
- Fine Arts: Arts management, video and time-based media, new media, interaction and emerging technologies, critical theory, and practice.
- Product/Industrial Designers: Visualization, technical processes, and/or form development.
- Fashion and Apparel Design: Pattern making, clothing construction, and design software.
- Art History: Fashion and apparel history, illustration, and animation history.
- 3D Modeling & Animation: Blender, digital sculpting, and/or interactivity using Unity.

Application Process and Deadline:

Interested applicants should submit the following materials in one (1) PDF document to **academicaffairs@miad.edu**:

1. A short letter of interest
2. A current résumé or curriculum vitae
3. Contact information (phone and email for three (3) professional references)

Applications will be accepted and reviewed on an ongoing basis. MIAD's needs shift each academic year. Submitted materials will be kept on file and reviewed as needs arise.

All final candidates must successfully complete reference and background checks. Only pending charges or convictions that are substantially related to the position being considered will be taken into account during the employment decision-making process. Conviction records that are not substantially related to the position or to campus safety will not be considered in hiring decisions.
