MIAD 2013-2014 exhibitions celebrate 20 years of design, contemporary collage and Cuban perspectives

MILWAUKEE... Through current design practices, new directions in collage and the re-imagination of history, the 2013-2014 exhibitions at the Milwaukee Institute of Art & Design celebrate contemporary approaches, while giving a nod to their origins.

According to Director of Galleries Mark Lawson, exhibitions of particular note include (starred below in text):

- **Brooks@20**, Oct. 8, 2013 Feb. 8, 2014, celebrates past exhibits and approaches to industrial design, the iconic genius for which the gallery is named, and the current practices and innovations from five global design firms indicating the future of the discipline.
- Co/exist: New Sensibilities in Collage, Oct. 18 Dec. 7, explores contemporary approaches to collage as informed by the digital realm and a shift in the definition and cultural boundaries of art.
- **First Person: Contemporary Cuban Art**, Jan. 17 Feb. 15, 2014, brings together a diverse group of Cuban-born artists re-imagining history through their independent artistic, political and personal points of view. Works in a variety of media including video, installation, sculpture, photography and painting.

MIAD's galleries are located in the college's Jane Bradley Pettit Building, 273 E. Erie Street, in Milwaukee's Historic Third Ward. Gallery hours are Tuesday – Saturday, 10 a.m. – 5 p.m., with the exception of school holidays. Admission is free. More information about building hours is available at miad.edu.

• Reflecting the quality of MIAD's first-year experience, this juried exhibit is a cross-section of varied works emphasizing creativity and problem solving submitted by Foundations students.

Multiple faculty members will participate in a panel discussion for the *Wisconsin Triennial*, Wednesday, September 25, 7 – 8:30 p.m. at Discovery World's Innovation Theater. Moderated by MIAD Core Coordinator Nicholas Frank, the panel discussion features faculty Tyanna Buie, Santiago Cucullu, Shana McCaw and Brent Budsberg, Kevin Miyazaki, Lynn Tomaszewski and Jason Yi. The artists will discuss their work and the contemporary issues that inform their studio practices.

Frank said this panel "will consider all aspects of arts education, from schools to museums, from artists to audiences, from students to teachers... Art is traditionally a mode of innovation and rebellion, but classrooms

and museums are places of calm and order. We begin from the provocative title of a James Elkins treatise on the subject, 'Why Art Cannot Be Taught.'"

The *Wisconsin Triennial* is organized by the Madison Museum of Contemporary Art and is on view at the museum from September 21, 2013 – January 5, 2014. The panel is co-sponsored by MMoCA and MIAD.
