- *Great Artists/Great Speakers*, an endowed program, supports visiting scholars and practitioners including Patrick Dougherty, environmental artist; Kelly McEvers, international correspondent for National Public Radio; and Jason Robert Brown, Tony Award-winning composer and lyricist. The program also enables students to travel to and experience performances, competitions, symposia, and research projects.
- *The Hipstamatic Entrepreneurship Award*, an endowed program, annually recognizes and awards \$5,000 to an exceptional graduating student who intends to pursue an entrepreneurial venture.
- The Melvin R. Laird Exceptional Artist Award, an endowed program, annually rewards an exceptional graduating student in the performing or visual arts by investing \$5,000 in his or her potential to become a successful leading artist.

# Noteworthy accomplishments as interim provost

- *Center for Academic Excellence and Student Engagement (CAESE)* Created an annual budget for CAESE. Charged the CAESE advisory board to develop a strategic plan to include a First Year Experience Coordinator, Assessment Coordinator, and Center Director. The board also developed a mission statement which was approved through faculty governance.
- *General Education Reform* Worked with the Faculty Senate to approve step four in a six-step process started in 2008 to create a new General Education Program. Step four includes the structural components and measureable learning outcomes.
