MILWAUKEE... Identity questions, interactive and technological installations, and a best-selling pop-up book artist propel the Milwaukee Institute of Art & Design's 2014-2015 season during the college's 40th year.

Highlighted exhibitions, which include related programming, and events according to Director of Galleries Mark Lawson, include:

- **Vital Technology, Oct. 17 Dec. 6**; Milwaukee-based artists Bryan Cera and Nathaniel Stern invite viewers to question their relationship with digital culture through large-scale, interactive and technologically sophisticated installations.
- MIAD Creativity Series: Mark Dziersk, Nov. 12; Joining MIAD for the sixth installment of the Creativity Series and holding a public conversation is Mark Dziersk, an award-winning expert in industrial design and brand management.
- **Engendered, Jan. 16 March 7**; Curated by MIAD faculty and current Pfister Artist in Residence Niki Johnson, *Engendered* voices the dynamics of gender identity and societal structures, striving for further action and dialogue to create personal meaning for viewers.
- MIAD Creativity Series: Robert Sabuda, Feb. 25; New York Times best-selling children's book creator, leading children's pop-up book artist and paper engineer Robert Sabuda joins the MIAD Creativity Series for a public presentation and Q&A.

Vital Technology, a duo exhibition with Milwaukee-based artists Bryan Cera and Nathaniel Stern, invites an exploration of movement as thinking and feeling through digital media. The show encompasses large-scale interactive installations – incorporating body- and motion-tracking, 3D scanning and printing, gesture recognition, and more – as well as more traditional art objects, and process documentation that come out of Cera and Stern's interactive studio practices. The artists ask how our ongoing relationships to digital culture continuously change what we move and think and feel.

Engendered engages the contemporary experience of personal identity through artwork that addresses our relationship to the modern body. Each artwork in Engendered voices the intriguing and often complicated dynamics of gender identity and the societal structures in which those identities are forged, grounded and resisted. The bedroom, the body and the odd take center stage, creating a space in which the subordinate experience becomes empowered. The exhibition strives to ignite further action and dialogue about the inequalities that touch each of our lives, and the strategies through which we negotiate those challenges.

Engendered is curated by Niki Johnson, MIAD faculty member and current Pfister Artist in Residence. The exhibition includes local artists Tyanna Buie (MIAD faculty), Tara Bogart (MIAD faculty) and Emily Belknap '07, as well as international artists Henrique Oliveira (Brazil), Luiz Philippe (Brazil) and Anders Krisar (Sweden), along with 15 additional artists.

Studio visits, artist talks and a panel discussion will feature participating artists Kim Dickey (Colorado), Greely Myatt (Tennessee) and Pixy Liao (New York). The Artist Talks will be held Thursday, February 19, 6 p.m., the Panel Discussion will be Friday, February 20, 6 p.m., and studio visits will be during the day on both February 19 and 20.

Mark Dziersk is the Managing Director at LUNAR Design, based in Chicago. He is a recognized expert in industrial design and brand management, and has worked for a large range of clients including Dove, Banana Republic and a pop-up store for Henri Bendel. Dziersk is also a sought-after contributor to Fast Company magazine, holds more than 100 patents and has won numerous awards, including Red Dot, IDEA Gold and ID Magazine Best of Category. He is past president of the Industrial Designers Society of America (IDSA), and the current editor of Innovation Magazine for IDSA. Teaching classes in the understanding of Design Thinking, Dziersk is also an adjunct professor at Northwestern University's Kellogg School of Management and the McCormick School of Engineering. Robert Sabuda is a #1 New York Times best-selling children's book creator, leading children's pop-up book

artist and paper engineer. Sabuda's recent books, such as those depicting the stories of *The Wonderful Wizard of Oz, Alice in Wonderland* and *Peter Pan* have received wide popular and critical acclaim. He is a two-time recipient of the *New York Times* Best Illustrated Book Award and has over five million books in print. He is the co-creator of the *Encyclopedia Prehistorica* pop-up trilogy, which has been translated into over 25 languages worldwide. Sabuda lives and works in New York.

MIAD was founded in 1974. It is the successor college to the Layton School of Art, founded in 1920. Seven faculty members from Layton pooled \$100 of their own funds and took no salaries to establish the college (briefly known as the Milwaukee School of Art), exemplifying the legendary dedication of MIAD faculty to their students.
