Participating artists Tony Matelli (MIAD alumnus), Mark Dion, Beauvais Lyons, Diane Fox and Jennifer Angus take both narrative and non-narrative approaches in examining the exhibition space and its engineered presentation as factual.

Curator Mark Lawson, MIAD Director of Galleries, wants viewers to think critically about fine art and natural history with help from *Just the Facts*.
