Viewers see improvements made from Thomas Edison's wax cylinder phonograph to the iPod, General Electric's first production monitor-top refrigerator to the stainless steel Electrolux and more.

Co-curated by James Wiemer and Mark Lawson with art direction by Dale Shidler, *User Experience* offers a glimpse into the engineering, ergonomic and emotional advancements that have reformed our products, and therefore our world.
